Director's Welcome

Dear Friends.

Welcome to the world-premiere production of CONCERTO by Alan Olejniczak! In 2014, Lyric Theatre established our New Works Initiative, under which we have produced at least one world premiere production every season. Over the last eight years, we have had the opportunity to develop and produce a broad spectrum of new plays and musicals that have shone a light on a variety of stories and human experiences.

I first met playwright and opera librettist Olejniczak in 2019 at the William Inge Theatre Festival where he was presenting a reading of his play VAL-KILL about the life of Eleanor Roosevelt. I

was so moved by his work and what struck me the most about his artistic point of view is that he tells the stories of significant historical figures through a modern lens, often revealing something about that person's life or character that is not widely known today.

When Olejniczak shared the script for CONCERTO with me, I knew right away that it would be an incredible opportunity and a good match for Lyric Theatre. While Lyric's seasons traditionally revolve around musical theatre, CONCERTO, as a play with music, allows us to bridge the gap between traditional plays and musicals, providing audiences with a live-performance experience that they might not otherwise have.



Lyric hosted a workshop of CONCERTO in September 2021 that culminated in a one-night public reading of the play at the Myriad Botanical Gardens. The success of that collaboration and positive audience feedback encouraged us to produce the full production you are seeing now.

CONCERTO reveals the story behind the creation of Tchaikovsky's infamous 1878 violin concerto. The plot focuses on the artist's relationship with his patron and investigates questions about how art was funded and supported in the past, while leaving room for conversation about how art continues to be funded today. The play also shares elements of Tchaikovsky's personal life that, while common knowledge to historians and music scholars, are not widely known by the general public, including his relationship with his protege, losif losifovich Kotek.

As the leader of an organization whose mission drives us to form collaborations with artists and arts organizations across Oklahoma City, I am particularly energized by the opportunity CONCERTO presents to work with my colleague Alexander Mickelthwate, Maestro of the Oklahoma City Philharmonic. He has played a pivotal role in CONCERTO's development, working with me, Alan, and the onstage musicians to create a Tchaikovsky-based musical score for the play. In addition, on September 9th, he opened the OKCPhil's season with a night of Tchaikovsky's music, including the violin concerto played by the stunning Ukrainian violinist, Anastasia Petryshak.

Thank you for coming and supporting this thoughtful conversation that considers all of our relationships to art and the creation of it. Next up is Lyric's brand-new spectacular production of A CHRISTMAS CAROL! Get your tickets now so you can be one of the first to experience this magical Oklahoma holiday tradition! And don't forget to subscribe to our 2024 Season of more exciting new works, wonderful classic musicals, and more!





Notes From Our Dramaturg

Before Tchaikovsky was the famous composer he's known as now, he was Pyotr Ilyich Tchaikovsky, the second son of Ilya and Aleksandra Tchaikovsky and one of seven children. He had dabbled in music for lots of his childhood, including a 'first composition' dedicated to his mother, but it wouldn't be until adulthood when he would truly study music. Even then, before he attended the Saint Petersburg

Conservatory and joined the Russian musical society as a whole, he had been a government official, a clerk in the Ministry of Justice, for three years. However, music finally won



him over in 1863 and he studied and graduated from the Conservatory in 1866, in one of its first classes.

But Tchaikovsky still couldn't fully dedicate himself to composing, joining the staff almost immediately as a professor of musical composition at the Moscow Conservatory after his graduation. It wouldn't be until he met Nadezhda von Meck, the woman who would become his friend and patroness, that Tchaikovsky could focus fully on his compositions. In 1876, von Meck, the recent widow of a railway tycoon, was a financially powerful and savvy business woman herself. She used that financial power and business acumen to support the arts she'd been a long-time lover of. Her father was an amateur violinist and she played piano while also having extensive knowledge of classical music. It was only after her husband's death

that she began feeding into that love with full force. This included her patronage of both Debussy and Tchaikovsky. While she never met Tchaikovsky – von Meck was a social recluse after her husband's death – their friendship did exist through the over one thousand letters written between them over a 13-year period.



This connection between von Meck and Tchaikovsky was not formed by either alone. It was thanks to losif Kotek, a young violinist who had worked for von Meck and been a student at the Moscow Conservatory Tchaikovsky taught at.

The two of them had a complicated relationship, one that waxed and waned in terms

of unrequited passion, but was still one of care and love. Kotek was a talented musician whose presence was a muse, arranger of music, and companion for Tchaikovsky.

These two, during a time of transition for Tchaikovsky, were integral parts to how the art he's so known for now were created and without them, it's hard to know how Tchaikovsky's career may have gone. Tchiaikovsky's Violin Concerto is still loved and praised today and Olejniczak's play Concerto gives us modern dramatic insight into how this concerto was created, who inspired it, and the woman who supported its creation.

MAESTRO ALEXANDER MICKELTHWATE (Music Supervisor) – As he prepares for his sixth season leading the Oklahoma City Philharmonic, Maestro Alexander Mickelthwate has fully become part of the community.

Born and raised in Frankfurt, Germany, Mickelthwate grew up in a home filled with classical music. He received his degree from the Peabody Institute of Music, and has worked with orchestras in Atlanta, Winnipeg and Los Angeles.

He is Music Director Emeritus of the Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra in Canada, and in 2022, accepted the position of Music Director for the prestigious Bear Valley Music Festival in Bear Valley, California. In early 2023, Mickelthwate traveled to Hanoi where he was Guest Conductor at the Vietnam National Symphony Orchestra.

Since he's been in Oklahoma, Mickelthwate has received numerous awards and honors, including being twice-named "The Face of Music" by 405 Magazine. The OKC Friday newspaper named him one of the "Top 50 Most Powerful," and the Ladies Music Club of Oklahoma City lauded him "Musician of the Year."

Mickelthwate lives in Oklahoma City with his wife of 25 years, Abigail, and sons Jack and Jacob. He is Artist in Residence at the University of Central Oklahoma where he enjoys working with the next generation of musicians, and conducting UCO's symphony orchestra.





JOANNA MIDDLETON-WEAVER (Hair Designer) – Bornin England, Joanne came to the United States in the late 1980s. Her career in theatre began in 1991 at what was at the time Washington Opera, now Washington National Opera. She has designed many opera productions at numerous companies throughout the U.S. AT LYRIC: Ain't Misbehavin', The Prom, The Sound of Music, Kinky Boots, Carousel, Matilda, Titanic, Newsies, Singin' in the Rain, Hello, Dolly!. OTHER THEATRE: The Life and Times of Malcolm X, Ainadamar, Detroit Opera City Opera; The Notebook, Chicago Shakespeare.

ALAN OLEJNICZAK (Playwright) is an opera librettist and playwright based in San Francisco. His operas, including *Atlas of Remote Islands* (2023) and *Unbound*, (2021) with music by Nathan Hall, and *Death of Ivan Ilych* (2021) with music by John Young.

Alan has two more premieres this year. His play, *Concerto* with the Lyric Theatre of Oklahoma, and his oratorio, *Yosef and the Counseling Angel* with music by Cole Thomason-Redus in Denver. He also has an upcoming opera workshop of *Midnight to Midnight* with Dante de Silva and Synchomy in Los Angeles in June 2024.

In September 2024, his opera, *Dreams Americanos* is premiering with I Colori dell'opera in Houston. Alan currently has six other operas in development and has set the text for the song cycle *A Light Rekindled* with Iranian-American composer Amin Sarrafi.

He is also the Playwright in Residence with The Proscenium, a London-based online theatre company. Their first season includes his plays *Next of Kin, Helt Texas,* and his adaptation of *A Christmas Carol* with David Ricardo-Pearce. His upcoming plays include *Workforce* and *Plunder,* written with writing lead Carl Prekopp.

Alan was the Artist in Residence for Hawai'i Volcanoes National Park and the first playwright ever selected by the National Parks Arts Foundation. Alan's other artist residencies include: Micro Galleries in Pātan, Nepal; Nes Residency in Skagaströnd, Iceland; Nocefresca in Milis, Sardinia; along with the prestigious The Arctic Circle Residency, sailing the icy waters around Svalbard. Residencies for 2024 include Micro Galleries in Chiang Mai, Thailand and The Arctic Circle Residency for an Alumni Expedition. Alan is currently an Opera Committee Member of the Dramatist Guild and an Advisory Board Member of Opera Parallèle.






